### Brixworth Class Autumn Curriculum Newsletter

## Welcome back to school, I hope you had a good rest and enjoyable summer holiday.

This term the majority of our work will centre around the theme of **World War II**, with many curriculum links, including History, Art, DT, English, Computing. As you are aware, expectations are now higher and therefore 100% commitment to learning is needed and we need children to arrive in school on time, ready to learn with regular attendance.

<u>School Values</u> - this term our focus will be on <u>Perseverance</u> and <u>Respect</u>.

Home Learning - Homework this year will consist of regular reading, spellings and times tables. It is essential that these basic skills are mastered and therefore I will not be giving out other forms of homework. Please ensure children are logging their reading in their planner with comments about authors' use of language, characters' actions and feelings and any recommendations for other readers. Spelling tests will take place on a Friday and times table tests will be every Monday. We will be organising a Spelling Bee each half term. (see separate letter)

We are still using MyMaths to enhance the children's learning and we ask that children use this resource at home, at least twice a week for 10 minutes. We have also subscribed to TT Rockstars and children should use this regularly to improve fluency of times table knowledge. Logons for both will be sent to you separately

**Reading** - We continue to need there to be a greater emphasis on comprehension and reasoning skills. Therefore, this will be the focus of some homework activities each week, for example book reviews, character and language studies, book recommendations, comparisons of books and/or authors. It is important that you discuss your child's book with them at least twice a week, to develop your child's skills further. I will be sending home a **reading challenge** for the year in the next few weeks to encourage children to read a variety of books by different authors.

PE P.E will take place on a Wednesday and Thursday this term. We will be focussing on Tennis skills and Fitness, Gymnastics and Hockey. Please, however, have P.E. kits in school at all times to cover any extra physical sessions that may take place. Children should have white or dark coloured trainers or plimsolls, not Converse or other high top trainers. Earrings should not be worn and long hair should be tied back. A named water bottle is also required.
