Welcome back, we hope you had a good break. The children have settled well and are becoming familiar with our routines in Year 3/4.

School Values – this term our focus will be on **Perseverance** and **Respect**.

Home Learning – Every Thursday the children will be tested on spellings given as homework and on their times tables. Please encourage your child to regularly practise their spellings and times tables. We are still using **MyMaths** to enhance the children's learning and we ask that children use this resource at home at least twice a week for 10 minutes. We have also subscribed to **TT Rockstars** and children should use this regularly to improve their fluency of times tables knowledge. Logons for both will be sent to you separately. If there are any specific things that need practice at home, these will be written in the planner.

Reading – We would recommend that your child reads with you or independently every day. We continue to need to place a greater emphasis on comprehension and reasoning skills and would ask that you discuss what your child is reading, talking about characters, setting and word choices of the author.

PE Kit - Children will take part in gymnastic lessons and invasion games. In the Autumn term, the Year 4s will go swimming on a Friday. They will require a swimming hat and swim suit or trunks. **PE kit should be in school every day** with suitable footwear. Children should also be provided with a named water bottle.
